Psalm 86:15(ESV) "But you, O Lord, are a God merciful and gracious, slow to anger and abounding in steadfast love and faithfulness."

## **Reflection Questions:**

- 1) How does your relationship with your earthly father impact your relationship with God?
- 2) Do you trust that God supplies all your needs?
- 3) What is one practical way you can shape your view of God's love?



#### Extended Devotion:

There is most definitely a stereotype of fathers (moms also) in today's society. Whether we're viewing a television show, listening to a song, or reading a book, article, the "dad type" is negatively pervading our society. Yes, everywhere we turn it's hard for us to shape and mold a Biblical view of fatherhood. Sometimes this is difficult because of our personal experiences with fathers or husbands. Regardless of what we've experienced or see all around us, we can take comfort and claim God's promises as our own and then live them out.

Throughout both the Old and New Testaments in the Bible, we see a dominant theme of God's patience and steadfast loving kindness toward His people. No matter how many times they broke His commandments, He bestowed grace and mercy. Yes, sometimes that meant disciplining them because He loved them. The Lord corrects those He loves (Hebrews 12:6) and this is not always easy for us. This can also comfort us with the realization that He loves us enough to do so.

In our fallen world, it's often hard for us to remember how good our Heavenly Father is in every area of our lives. He not only corrects us to draw us back to Him, but He also supplies every one of our needs. When our struggles seem abundant, it's easy to forget that God is bigger than our struggles.
